Artzebo is offering two new activities in March for the Arapahoe Nation
Y- Guide & Princess and Trailblazers& Trailmates programs.

Each of these activities will take about an hour. (depending on the number of guests attending) Instruction and materials are included. The fee for each participant is \$7. Both activities require a return to pick up after being fired.

Clay Shakers

Fathers and sons / daughters will sculpt and assemble their own clay shakers using red Indian clay. Symbols to match their name or the name of their tribe may be carved on the exterior.

The completed clay shakers are appropriate for use as tribal musical instruments or could also apply to the fourth Aim in association to listening while others "speak", in rhythm. The clay shakers may also be used to accompany songs or stories during your tribal meetings.

Fish Tiles

Fathers and sons / daughters should come prepared with the sketch of a fish that would fit on a 6 x 6 square which they have identified or studied. Each participant needs to bring a photograph, or a downloaded picture showing the colors, number of fins, shape of the tail, and the name of the fish.

Each participant would be provided a 6x6 bisque tile to draw his or her fish on and then paint using ceramic glazes. The name of the fish would also be added. A collection of these tiles could be mounted together as a collective art piece or used as individual trivets or coasters.

Other possible designs may include, name symbols, a tribal symbol, birds, trees, Aim symbols, etc.
